### **Street Robbery Prevention**

There have been four armed robberies in our neighborhood in a recent five-week period. The first occurred between January 20th and the week of February 10th. Three were just after midnight and one was around 7:30 p.m. There is no suspect information yet, but information is being sought from the Police Department. Follow these suggested tips to help keep you from becoming a victim:

- Avoid walking alone on the street after 9:00 p.m. If you must walk alone at night, use well-lit streets with as much car traffic as possible, and walk near the curb
- When streets are relatively empty, make eye contact with everyone you pass, and keep yourself an arm's length away from them. Walk briskly and confidently.
- At night, avoid public parks, vacant lots, and areas with a lot of trees and bushes.
- When waiting for a bus or for a ride, if the area is deserted, keep your back against a wall in a well-lit section.
- When walking to your car at night, have your keys in your hand and be ready to open the door.
- Try to avoid using ATMs late at night. If you must use one, choose an ATM in an attended location, such as a supermarket. At the very least, make sure

the ATM is well lit, and be aware of any people "loitering" in the area. Do not go to the ATM by yourself.

- At home, before answering the door, check the peephole or side window to make sure you know your visitor.
- Keep your doors locked when driving your car. If someone approaches your car while you are stopped, be prepared to step on the gas.
- Don't carry your purse hanging loosely from your shoulder. Clutch it tightly under your arm or, better yet, avoid carrying a purse and keep a wallet in your pocket instead.
- If you are robbed, obey the robber's instructions. Keeping your cash in a separate money clip or pouch will allow you to hand it over without sacrificing your credit cards, identification, and personal papers. Try to memorize your robber's physical features, clothing, motor vehicle, and direction of flight. Call 9-1-1 immediately.

#### The Annual WPNA Yard Sale

Our annual yard sale is still a while off (put it on your calendar – Saturday, June 2), but now is a good time to start planning.

Here is how this works. The Association pays for a newspaper ad to attract buyers. Every home that has registered their sale with WPNA is included on a flyer that shows a map of the neighborhood and lists sale addresses and items for sale. A stack of flyers is given to each registered address.

Anyone who stops by one home can find the things that are of interest to them on the list and receives directions to all the other sales. The more homes that are registered, the more attractive this neighborhood yard sale is to buyers.

The sale is also advertised by signs put up around the neighborhood a week before sale day.

If you are considering having a yard (or garage or porch) sale this spring, join your neighbors on June 2 and increase traffic and buyers to our neighborhood. If you hear of neighbors who are planning to have sales this summer, encourage them to participate on that date, too.
