Upcoming General Meeting Tuesday, September 16, 7-8 p.m.

In the last newsletter we described the systematic codes inspection program the city is implementing. The West Plaza was selected as one of the pilot neighborhoods (see "Systematic Code Inspections Coming to the West Plaza," June-July-August issue). The purpose of the program is to bring properties in the neighborhood into compliance with Kansas City, Missouri housing ordinances.

The program began this summer and has been in progress since then. Come to this meeting at which Ms. Rashaw, Code Enforcement Officer, will talk about the areas that have been inspected and the code violations that are being pursued. She will also answer any questions or concerns you may have about the inspection program.

Neighborhood Cleanup October 11

The fall cleanup event will take place on Saturday, October 11, from 8 a.m. until the dumpsters fill up (usually by noon or so). Two dumpsters will be provided – one for yard waste (leaves and brush, grass clippings, etc.) and one for household trash. The dumpsters will be located near the northeast corner of Westwood Park on Wyoming. Neighborhood volunteers will be on hand to assist you in unloading your vehicle. Yard waste may be bundled or loose or in paper bags, but may not be in plastic bags or non-degradable containers. If you are bundling tree branches, please use natural fiber twine, like cotton, jute, or sisal, not plastic or wire.

These bi-annual cleanup events are jointly sponsored by the WPNA and the City of Kansas City, who share the \$300 cost of each dumpster. This is a valuable service and benefit to our neighborhood. We are grateful to Constance Tate and the staff at the Department of Public Works for providing the resources for the event.

The City's rules require that only West Plaza residents participate in this event, so we will be asking everyone to sign the registration sheet. The event is not for businesses or commercial builders. We cannot accept large appliances, tires, batteries, auto parts, or hazardous materials. These items must be taken to the Environmental Campus at 4707 Deramus for disposal (by appointment: 816-784-2080).

Come early on Saturday and take advantage of this terrific free service offered by your neighborhood. This is a great opportunity to clean out the attic, the basement, the garage, and the yard.

Neighborhood Watch Program

As you may have heard recently, there has been some breaking-and-entering crime activity in our neighborhood. On one night, two houses were broken into by cutting glass and unlocking a door or window. It is believed that the same individual perpetrated these crimes: one on the 4400 block of Genessee, and one on the 4700 block of Terrace. A purse was taken from one house, and some electronics from the other.

It is important to remember during the nice weather that windows that are left open during the evening provide easy access for criminals. The window that this particular burglar entered, however, was not open. So, it would appear that we have to take extra precautions at our homes.

The police are working hard to apprehend these criminals, but we are equally responsible for protecting ourselves. This includes closing blinds, thinning out shrubs and bushes close to the house that criminals can hide in, and locking your doors and windows. The KCMO Police Department, as a free service to the public, will come to your house to perform a crime prevention inspection. They will make suggestions about what you can do to reduce your chances of being a victim in your home.

One of our neighbors, Susan Karels, attended a recent Neighborhood Watch meeting to get our neighborhood involved in this program. This is simply an agreement that any neighbor makes to watch for strange activity, suspicious vehicles, or people in their area, and if necessary, call 911. Master Patrol Officer James Schreiver has urged us to call 911 if you have any concern at all about suspicious activity or people in the neighborhood. The police will make the decision to go to the scene or not.

Free Paint Available for Eligible Kansas City, MO Homeowners

In 2007 the City of Kansas City, Missouri Paint Program provided free paint and supplies to 310 homeowners. The program is available again this year to help homeowners improve their property.

"This program gives eligible homeowners highquality exterior paint for their homes at no cost," said Bob Jackson, manager of the Property Preservation Division of the Neighborhood and Community Services Department.

Eligible applicants can receive paint, primer, caulking, and other supplies related to the painting of their home, up to a total cost of \$500. Eligible applicants must meet the following qualifications:

- Reside in Kansas City, MO
- Own and reside in the property to be painted

- Be the owner of only one property
- Meet the following household income guidelines:

0	One person	\$38,300
0	Two people	\$43,800
0	Three people	\$49,250
0	Four people	\$54,700
0	Five people	\$59,100
0	Six people	\$63,500
0	Seven people	\$67,850
0	Eight or more people	\$72,250

Paint recipients must make all necessary repairs and properly prepare their houses for painting prior to receiving their supplies. After an inspector determines that a house is ready to be painted, a voucher will be awarded to the homeowner that allows him to choose the color of Sherwin-Williams paint he wishes to receive. Paint selection is limited to standard, in-store colors; no color matching will be done.

"Sometimes homeowners need a little help with the upkeep of their property. Through this program, we are able to help people, which helps improve our neighborhoods one house at a time," Jackson said.
